No Complaints with anything, happy with D Permits, flag on CD13 side was the concerts; posted on Baxter. AS CD13 gets complaints they refer that to LAPD.

WAZE and Google is being referred to beholden to do anything, they are going to look at it in terms of overall traffic in the area, they are not going to look at the Dodgers schedule and more to the flaggy the DOT to WAZE and saying there are plans or mitigation onto WAZE; software problem when someone uses the short cuts.

CD13 is working on CD1 motion and if they can add more streets to the restrictions and permits

CD13 when they met with DOT they have their locations that they are working on over the years, so they can deploy and move around as needed. And weather needs to be a factor.

Patricia explains that they deploy on attendance, pitching schedule.

Tad, Dodgers need to fix the ingress into Dodgers

HUGO explains that we continue to work towards this solution of what is going on....

Patricia explains that they have to understand what is going on and happy to work with the council office and what is going on. Patricia can get an answer in a couple of weeks about their support.

Pete explains that Dodgers is being active to complaints but should be proactive with the problems.

Patricia does trash removal- already pay the company, who it is, map and after, who it is? - I would like to see who-

What it takes and what it costs, does this require, Big Belly, trash CD1- follow up with that and work with them. Patricia will provide a map for it.

Lydia speaks about the carts that were in her neighborhood about the photos and the people who are not doing this.

TRAFFIC STUDY-

Dodgers will support the study but in terms of paying for it, they are wanting to stay out of it as it is the city jurisdiction

The Echo Park Neighborhood Council (EPNC) is requesting that the following Community Impact Statement be attached to City Council File: 17-0728

In 1960, The City of Los Angeles Department of City Planning conditionally granted a Conditional Use Permit for the construction and operation of Dodger Stadium, rather than reclassify the zoning "so that various conditions, controls and limitations could be placed upon the development of the Stadium area and the operation of the Stadium." Many of these conditions were included to protect the lives of the community within which the stadium resides.

In recent years, an increasing number of violations of the CUP have gone unchecked with the expansion of events beyond baseball, and changes to policies regarding game days. The very safety and quality of the surrounding communities lives have been endangered due to increased traffic, updated traffic web application, and lack of community involvement and dialogue with Dodgers management.. Despite numerous requests and grievances over the last four years, conditions affecting community stakeholders have only continue to deteriorate. The Dodgers have the greatest resources available to them – immense capital, a huge staff and the support of the city.

To bring this more current in this new season, a new Community Relation director, Patricia Whelan, was hired last year. The following points were discussed with Ms. Whelan at the Dodgers Ad Hoc Committee meeting of the Echo Park Neighborhood Council on December 8, 2016:

- Updated Traffic Study due to many changes in our traffic patterns
- Trash Removal Plan following Dodgers' games

- Better use and appointment of DOT officers to direct traffic with greater responsiveness to community feedback and needs; in particular Solano Canyon bottleneaking
- Neighborhood Passes for third lane usage, similar to Pasadena
- Issues around increased frequency of fireworks, including noise pollution and lateness of cutoff time
- Issues around frequency, duration, traffic and noise from non-baseball events
- Dodger Hotline added for neighborhood complaints
- Opening gates early to reduce partying in the adjacent neighborhoods and reduce traffic
- Reinstatement of tailgating within the Stadium parking lots prior to game time to spread out arrivals and discourage partying within the adjacent communities and public parks
- Exceeding the number of non-baseball related events per year as outlined in the CUP
- More consistent deployment of trash pick up services throughout the neighborhoods following all games and events
- Reinstatement of the Community Advisory Council, including assembly of all impacted neighborhoods, in regular group meetings, with agendas issued and minutes taken to track issues and solutions and monitor progress

A promise to address these issues and create a plan was then made between Dodgers Ad Hoc Committee of the EPNC and the Dodgers' management team. Several meetings have taken place to address these issues, both within the Neighborhood Council System and outside in private meetings hosted by the Dodgers' team. At the date of this letter, repeated attempts by numerous community stakeholders to work with the stadium's current ownership to rectify their abuses have largely been ignored and have yielded **no** discernible changes in their policy or continue to be kicked down the road to tackle in the future. This is unacceptable.

As stated in the Conditional Use Permit for the stadium, issued on August 4, 1960, ".....this Conditional Use approval shall be **subject to revocation** in the same manner as provided under Section 12.27-B, 7 of the Municipal Code for revocation of zone variances, **if the conditions herein contained are not strictly complied with.**" And in particular the Permit stipulates the following:

3. (e) The control of lights, public address systems, and signs so as to prevent annoyance to occupants of adjacent properties;

9. That all loudspeaker and public address systems utilized on the site shall be so modulated and directed that the sound emanating therefrom will not be detrimental to the occupants of adjacent properties.

The original Conditional Use Permit acknowledged and respected the community within which it resides. We expect our local officials in Council District 1 and 13 to

enforce the required conditions. We depend on our local government to support and represent the best interests of the entire community, and not just those with the deepest pockets and greatest resources.

We all know that the new ownership is enjoying great success with the team, to the delight of their many fans. Attendance has increased by a phenomenal 30% from the previous ownership, but while the Dodgers are doing much better, the stakeholders residing within the Echo Park Neighborhood Council area, are doing much worse due to the failure to address these issues outlined above.

Therefore we request that CD 1 and CD 13 propose an immediately plan to implement the following:

- Traffic Study is Scheduled
- DOT map be updated with the new traffic study requirements.
- Trash Plan is immediately completed.
- Neighborhood Advisory Council is implemented immediately and maintained on a monthly basis during the season.
- A special committee is set up to follow through on the WAZE and Google issues that create havoc on the traffic systems within the neighborhood.

If these requests cannot be implemented during the season we request that the CUP be revoked.
